Parents & Guardians

We break down how quickly social platforms can become unsafe without proper guardrails. Parents receive practical guidance on safety settings, modern online threats, and how to foster open, ongoing conversations with their children about technology use.

Seniors

Older adults explore the most common online scams targeting their age group and learn how to identify misleading AI-generated information, images, and software. **The goal is simple: confidence and protection while navigating the internet.**
